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## **Poultry Department Rules**

Richard Butler, superintendent.

### **General Rules:**

1. All poultry to be exhibited at the 2010 McCurtain County Free Fair shall go through a pre-entry process as follows. All poultry will be brought to the fairgrounds on Saturday Aug 7<sup>th</sup>, 2010 (or approximately 30 days preceding the fair on day to be set with Oklahoma State Livestock Inspector), and tested for Pullorum/Typhoid and abnded and negative Pullorum/Typhoid test. Testing will be free and will replace the required testing on the day of entry at the fair.
2. All poultry will receive a band (wing or leg) at this time and this bamd will be recorded and must be on the bird when they arrive at the fairgrounds for entry.
3. Any bird not having appropriate band number will be disqualified
4. Any bird not meeting above entry requirements will be allowed for exhibition only. No entry, no competition, No premium money, no ribbon. Exhibitors must furnish negative Pullorum/Typhoid test before birds can be exhibited
5. The American Standard of Perfection, adopted by the American Poultry Association shall be the guide for classification and judging.
6. Show is to be judged by comparison.
7. Poultry exhibits showing any signs of disease will be removed from the fairgrounds.
8. Maximum entries per exhibitor is 50.

### **Junior Poultry Division**

#### **Rules:**

1. Chickens, including bantams, shall be entered as individuals (cockerels and pullets only).
2. All chickens, turkeys, geese, guineas and ducks must have been hatched after Jan. 1 of the current year.
3. Poultry exhibits showing any disease or disqualifications to their breed will be excluded from premiums and/or removed from grounds.
4. Poultry entries must be purebred.
5. Each exhibitor may enter:
  - a. Chickens as individual entries (not trios).
  - b. Six exhibits per breed of each of the following chickens or ducks.  
Three exhibits per class of geese, guineas or turkeys.
  - c. All varieties or breeds geese, guineas or turkeys will be judges together.
6. No exhibits released until 8:00 p.m. Saturday.

#### **Awards**

1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place each class will receive premiums of \$5, \$4 and \$3 respectively.

Grand champion overall \$5 and rosette.

Reserve grand champion overall \$4 and rosette.

Large fowl champion \$5, rosette and trophy.

Reserve large fowl champion \$4, rosette and trophy.

Bantam champion \$5, rosette and trophy.

Reserve bantam champion \$4, rosette and trophy.

Champion waterfowl will receive a trophy and \$5

Reserve champion waterfowl will receive a trophy and \$4

All other classes of poultry (other than chickens and ducks) will receive ribbons only with placings of 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>. This includes turkeys and guineas.

All champion and reserve trophies are sponsored by the Southeast Oklahoma Poultry Club.

## **Division 1 – Section 200**

### **Large Fowl**

#### **Class 1, American**– Varieties of:

Rhode Island Red, Wyandottes, Dominiques, New Hampshire, Javas, Plymouth Rocks, Jersey Giants, Lammonas and other breeds.

#### **Class 2, Asiatic**– Varieties of:

Brahmas, Lanshans, Cochins and other breeds.

#### **Class 3, English**– Varieties of:

Cornish, Red Caps, Dorking, Suffex, Austrolop, Orpingtons and other breeds.

#### **Class 4, Mediterranean**– Varieties of:

Minocas, Buttercups, Anconas, Leghorns, Spanish, Campines and other breeds.

#### **Class 5, Continental**– Varieties of:

Spits, Lahenueldens, Houdans, Hamburgs, Polish, Faverolles and other breeds.

#### **Class 6, Game**– Varieties of:

Modern Games, Old English Games, Modern, Black Breasted Red, Orientals, Barred, Old English, Red Pyle, Brawn Red, Lemon Blue, Wheaton, Creal, Brassy Black, Black, Blue Red, Silver Duck Wing, Spangled and other breeds.

## **Division 2 – Section 201**

### **Bantams**

#### **Class 1, Single Comb Clean Legged**– Varieties of:

Japanese, Plymouth Rock, New Hampshire, Rhode Island Port, Leghorns, Minocas, Orpingtons and other breeds.

#### **Class 2, Rose Comb Cleaned Legged**– Varieties of:

Sea Brights, Hamburgs, Rose Combs, Wyandotts, Antwerp, Rhode Island Red and other breeds.

#### **Class 3, All Other Combs Cleaned Legged**– Varieties of:

Polish, Cornish and other breeds.

#### **Class 4, Feather Legged**– Varieties of:

Cochins, Silkies, Booted, Brahmans, Fizzle, Sultans and other breeds.

#### **Class 5, Game**– Varieties of:

Barred, Old English, Red Pyle, Brawn Red, Lemon Blue, Modern, White, Black Breasted Red, Black, Creal, Silver Duck, Wing, Spangled, Blue Red, Wheaton, Silver Blue, Brassy Red and other breeds.

## **Division 3 – Section 202**

### **Eggs**

#### **Class 1<sup>st</sup> 2<sup>nd</sup> 3<sup>rd</sup>**

1. White– One dozen \$3 \$2 \$1
2. Brown– One dozen \$3 \$2 \$1
3. Natural Colored– One dozen \$3 \$2 \$3

#### **Division 4 – Section 203**

##### **Breeders**

###### **Rules**

1. This class must consist of one breeder male and three breeder females of one breed, less than one year of age.
2. Any breed or variety may be entered.
3. Exhibitors may have only one entry.
4. Meatiness is the chief concern.

#### **Division 5 – Section 204**

##### **Broilers**

###### **Rules**

1. This class consists of four young birds of the broiler strains, all male, female or mixed sexes.
2. Uniformity and meatiness are the chief concern.
3. Suggested weights are 3 ½ to 5 pounds each.

##### **Turkeys**

Toms and hens are shown together.

**Class– 1** Ribbons only.

#### **Division 7 – Section 206**

##### **Ducks**

Class 1, bantam ducks, varieties of call ducks, fast Indies, mallards and other breeds.

Class 2, light ducks, varieties of khakis, runners and other breeds.

Class 3, medium ducks, varieties of Cayugas, Swedish, buff and other breeds,

Class 4, heavy ducks, varieties of rouens, pekings, muscovies and other breeds.

##### **Geese**

Class 3, heavy geese, varieties of Africans, emdens, Toulouse and other breeds.

**Class 1-3:** Ribbons only.
